TRUTH: Thinks, speaks and acts truthfully

Demonstrates integrity, promise-keeping and loyalty

FAIRNESS: Treats all people equally without favoritism or prejudice _____

Confirms information is correct before making a judgment or decision; corrects mistakes immediately, and doesn't take advantage of other's mistakes.

GOODWILL: Exerts influence through acts of compassion that improve global awareness and understanding, improve the community, and build co-operative relationships



Uses the strength of Rotary to make things happen for those in need or to make life better in a community

FRIENDSHIP: Promotes a caring work environment enhancing employee morale and retention

BENEFICIAL: Promotes win/win situations in business relationships

Criteria for Nomination (Emphasis on Servant Leader)

Is a Servant Leader (a Rotary Benchmark) who wants to serve and meet the highest needs of others, which moves them to lead

Those served grow as people becoming healthier, wiser, freer, more autonomous, and more likely themselves to become servant leaders

Creates a legacy that builds the organization they are leading and ensure it will sustain when they move on

Understands and accept everything they do will directly affect other projects, organizations and issues
